View from the Pew

A reflection on Lent

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation for Christ's birth, correspondingly Lent is a time of penitential preparation for Christ's death on the cross and resurrection.

Many of us will have enjoyed Pancake Day and then marked Lent by abstaining from chocolate or another personal luxury for 40 days, as Jesus fasted in the desert and endured the temptations of Satan. We end ours on Easter Sunday with Easter egg hunts, and gatherings with family and friends.

This year, along with a group from Holy Cross and St Paul's, I took part in a Lent course. Each week we met to learn about prayer, using our Lords Prayer as the basis to reflect on the elements of Adoration, Petition, Intercession, Unanswered Prayer, Contemplation, Listening and Spiritual Warfare.

This was way outside my comfort zone; however, I was challenged and committed myself to experiencing something new.

The culmination of the course was a 'Soaking'. With little knowledge and some trepidation of what to expect we met at St Paul's with duvets, blankets and pillows. We started by laying on the floor, a cellist played sounds that reverberated around the room and the floor, whilst we all focussed on prayer. Each of us experienced it differently: I felt the tumultuous, epic nature of the mountains, through to the flow of the tide or the rhythm of breath, into a final dawn or awakening. To my surprise I was totally immersed, and couldn't wait to share my experience with others.

I gained so much by experiencing this period of Lent with a focus which made me consider and have a better understanding of the true meaning of Easter. The message that resonated was that by dying Christ took away our sin, and through his resurrection gave us eternal life.

However you celebrated Easter, I hope you feel renewed and energised along with the 'Darling Buds of May'.

Holy Cross – PCC March Meeting

Holy Cross Parochial Church Council (PCC) meets 4–5 times a year, chaired by Rev Sarah Colins its purpose is to oversee the ministry and running of Holy Cross Church.

The first quarter of the year has been a busy one with the Rector spending time in Sarratt school and leading Bereavement and Lent Courses. In addition, Easter activities with the school, the mother and toddler group, and the youth group (which meet in St Pauls Parish Rooms but are open to the whole Benefice and are led/supported by members of the church community) were discussed and the growing number of attendees was welcomed.

With Spring approaching the programme of work to maintain the church yard, and to repair and paint the guttering, gates and railings was agreed. A "wild area" for wildlife will be maintained in the older part of the church yard and plans for the incorporation of the "new" church yard are progressing. A new heating system, meeting the needs of the Diocese to became carbon neutral are advancing.

The financial position of the church was discussed, and it was noted that the "Parish Share", which is a voluntary contribution that Holy Cross makes to the Diocese to cover the cost of the Incumbent and Diocesan overheads, is unlikely to be met in full this year.

SEAN AYLETT



At school, Sean displayed an artistic talent and was also a keen rugby player and his interest in architecture and design led to his decision to become an architect. After he completed his first 3 years of intermediate study, he went to the US to work for a firm of architects in Baltimore and while there he travelled around to visit buildings of interest. He returned after a year to resume his final 2 years of

study, graduating in 1967. This was when he and Vicky, who he met while they were students, were married. In 1973, after their daughters were born, the family settled happily in Sarratt and the children went to Sarratt School.

Sean was keen on staying fit and played rugby into his fifties; he loved skiing and enjoyed playing table tennis in the u3a group. He also enjoyed being part of the u3a French conversation group. Singing was another interest and he was pleased to join the choir in the annual Carol services at Holy Cross and the summer Flower Festival concerts.

Sean's architectural career continued at the GLC and privately at this time he designed a factory for his father-in-law's company in Harlesden. Some years later, he moved to the London Borough of Haringey where he headed a team of architects working on, among various other projects, a sheltered housing scheme in Andover with an emphasis on landscaping. A model of this scheme was exhibited at the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition.

He later moved to the private firm of Scott Brownrigg and Turner in Covent Garden and finally, in 1990, he started working on his own account, winning awards from the RIBA for a number of his local projects. He was very pleased when the opportunity arose to be the architect of the extensive renovation and rebuilding of the old village hall in Sarratt, liaising with the committee and the contractors to produce the present Sarratt Village Hall which is a real asset in the village. The many varied events which take place in the Hall demonstrate its success and versatility, especially as shown by the annual Sarratt Festival of Music, giving the audience the chance to enjoy the excellence of the performances here in the village.


CORONATION WALK

Sarratt Community Garden - May 2024

April has been such a busy month in the Community Garden – everything bursting into life and growing with such vigour. It has been really quite cold, but even in spite of that, things are happening early, as seems to be the pattern in our changing climate. All the daffodils and tulips have now been and gone, and the alliums and peonies are beginning to take on colour – very nice to see, but I would love to hold them back a little longer!

If you'd ever like to join us, we meet at 10.30 on Saturdays at either the garden behind the shop, or at the allotment site – there is a well-behaved WhatsApp group where details of the next session is posted.

On Sunday 19th May, we will be opening for the National Garden Scheme – there will be a jazz trio, teas and general jollity from 11-4pm. Last year the NGS raised £3 million for nursing charities, to which we contributed $\pounds 1000 -$ let's try to do even better this year!

Sarratt Wildlife Volunteers

We had a change of venue on Sunday April 14th . We were working at Dawes Common, a place we



hadn't been to for some years. It was looking beautiful - the sun was shining and the bluebells were just starting to cover the ground with a haze of blue. A buzzard circling overhead was a welcome sight.

The only slight blot on the landscape were the piles of brash, which were left by the electricity workers when they cut back branches from the overhead lines. This must be done periodically or the residents of Sarratt Bottom may have no power if a branch falls - the lines go straight through the middle of the Common. The tree surgeons had piled

up the cuttings here and there, but now they were on top of the bluebells. Our task was to remove these to more hidden places and form "habitat heaps" for wild creatures to shelter.



We were very careful to avoid as many bluebells as possible, and not to trample on anything, so the work although not too heavy was sometimes tricky. It did look better at the end of the morning, and the bluebells will definitely benefit.

Not a huge amount to report on this month as the Scout Group has only just started back after the


Easter break, but a couple of notable events are included below.



The following report covers the key points arising from the SPC Meeting held on Tuesday 9 April.

ANNOUNCMENTS

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Tuesday 30 April in the Village Hall. This is an opportunity for Parishioners to hear a summary of the Council's financial performance and activities during the previous financial year ending 31 March 2024, and to present the Grants awarded this year to local organisations. All members of the public are welcome to attend, and refreshments will be served. There will also be a presentation by Greg Edmund on the archaeological finds he recovered from Sarratt Green earlier this year.

PLANNING

There was no update on Enforcement Cases this month as the TRDC Enforcements Officer was on leave. The most recent list, from last month, can be viewed on the SPC website. There has been no further information received on the outcome of Burlington Planning Appeal.

Planning Applications:

Where appropriate SPC also make an additional comment encouraging the applicant to use the opportunity of a change to a building, if approved, to significantly increase the energy efficiency of the construction beyond the requirements set by building regulations. This statement has been omitted from the comments below to save space.

• 24/0295/RSP: 13 Deadman's Ash Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6AL - Part <u>Retrospective: Erection of single storey side and rear infill extension</u>, <u>and enlargement of front porch, installation of AC Unit</u>. *SPC: We have no objection to the proposed additions as long as they have no impact on the neighbours. We do have a significant concern that these additions were implemented without prior proper permission, which did not allow for proper consideration before completing the works*. • 24/0459/FUL: 1 Micklefield Green Cottages, Sarratt Road, WD3 6AH - Change of use of land to equestrian and erection of stables and associated hardstanding.

SPC: No Objection. If officers are minded to approve we would request that conditions be added that restrict any future change to residential use, and this development remains ancillary to the main dwelling.

• 24/0454/FUL: The Spinney, Dawes Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6BQ -Demolition of existing shed and partial demolition of existing annexe, and renovation of existing annexe; construction of a single storey rear extension to main dwelling, with chimney, erection of front porch, associated rooflights, and changes to the fenestration, with external materials including timber cladding and stone walls SPC: Objection on the basis that this application will provide a more than 40% increase in size and is over development within the

Greenbelt.

• 24/0365/PDT: Briar Bank, Dimmocks Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6AP -Prior approval: Enlargement of the dwellinghouse by the construction of one additional storey (2.6m height) and raising of ridge to result in an overall height of 7.8m (Class AA)

SPC: Objection on the basis that this application will provide a more than 40% increase in size and is over development within the Greenbelt. We are also concerned that this development will reduce the limited stock of bungalows in the parish.

- 24/0363/PDNA: Newhall Farm, Sarratt, WD4 9AH Prior Notification: Erection of barn for hay storage. SPC: Noted.
- 24/0347/FUL: Hunterswood Lodge, Penman's Green, Sarratt, WD4 9AY - Demolition of existing garage and construction of a new detached garage with an attached store and extension to residential curtilage.

SPC: No Objection.

• 24/0328/FUL: St Georges Cottage, Bottom Lane, Sarratt, WD4 9AJ - <u>Conversion of existing garage into ancillary annexe, with</u> accommodation in the roof space served by front dormer windows and rear rooflights.

SPC: Objection on the basis that this application creates a new dwelling in the Greenbelt. If officers are minded to approve we would request that conditions be added to ensure this building remains ancillary to the main dwelling and permitted development rights removed from this site.

Recent TRDC Planning Decisions:

- 24/0098/FUL: Winchwood, Windmill Hill, Chipperfield, WD4 9DA - Demolition of existing sheds and erection of carport and garage building with EV charging point. SPC: No objection TRDC: Approved
- 24/0084/FUL: Treelings, Dunny Lane, Belsize, WD4 9DQ -Demolition of existing conservatory and construction of single storey side and rear extension; alterations to existing dormers including removal of front dormer and replacement with two dormers and front rooflight; removal of existing greenhouse and rear extension to existing outbuilding, extension of rear patio; alterations to front landscaping works including provision of stepped access, front driveway and parking.

SPC: No objection TRDC: Approved

• 24/0092/FUL: Orchard Yard, The Orchard, The Green, Sarratt, WD3 6AT - Erection of pitched roof to existing garage with rear solar panels.

SPC: No objection. TRDC: Withdrawn

• 23/1794/FUL: Land at the rear of 47 Church Lane, Sarratt -Demolition of existing structures and construction of five detached dwellings with associated parking, bin and cycle storage, landscaping and access improvements.

SPC: We support the use of this brownfield site as a location for new dwellings. We welcome the low height of the proposed dwellings and the predominantly single story design. We note that Sarratt housing needs shows there is not a requirement for additional 4 bedroom dwellings. Any harm from additional dwellings in Green Belt should be offset by this site being used for smaller, affordable dwellings that meet local housing needs.

TRDC: Refused (inappropriate development in the Green Belt)

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

The King Charles III Coronation Walk is almost complete. Cllr Garvey and Andrew Whitewood are posting the route, and the Explorer Scouts will be installing the way markers at the end of April as part of their community activity work for their Chief's Scout Platinum Award. The booklet to accompany the walk is almost finished, and Cllr Garvey thanked Mike Edmund for his extensive work on this. Mike Edmund is also assisting with the design of the Information Board for the Pump on the Green.

There are 6 vacant allotments. Any parishioners wishing to take on the tenancy for a plot, or half plot, should contact the Parish Clerk.

The Parish Clerk will be reaching out to the Footpath Wardens Group to encourage regular reporting of matters needing attention. Anyone interested in joining this group as part of their walks around the Parish should contact the Parish Clerk

HIGHWAYS

The wettest February and March on record has proved exceptionally damaging to road surfaces and our local roads are struggling to recover. Bottom Lane at the junction with Tom's Hill has been particularly badly affected. It is becoming obvious that maintenance of damaged roads is not achieving the desired outcome and that new road building techniques must be employed in the future. At present cyclists cannot be encouraged to take to our local roads with confidence in their own safety.

Environmental scientists at CEMEX (quarry site) have detected a sewerage outflow adjacent to the M25 - the route of the main sewer from Sarratt. Thames Water attended to suck up the fluid effluent, however, the outflow has renewed itself. Although CEMEX have contacted Thames Water again, no action has yet been taken.

Herts Highways dismissed Cllr Diggins appeals for assistance with speed restrictions within the Parish, as they believe that there is 'no support' for this locally. Cllr Diggins has sought to refute this impression and SPC is now in conversation with the local Police about this matter.

The last fingerpost pointing to KGV on the new sign opposite the Village Hall has finally been installed.

POLICY AND RESOURCES

Susan Cook the Internal Auditor has met with Cllr Lowry and the Parish Clerk and issued her Interim Report, and in summary advised: "*There are no matters arising that require a formal comment or recommendation.*"

The bank transactions and bank statements for March were reviewed and approved. As part of SPC's annual review cycle of its policies and procedures the following were reviewed and updated versions adopted: Environment, Sarratt Green, Memorial Benches & Trees, Signs & Posters, Filming on Parish Land. Copies of these can be found on the SPC website.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE

A further Planning Application for Green Street in Chorleywood has been submitted – this time for the development of 300 homes. There are 30 days in which to object. A second application for 645 (reduced from 700) will follow. Schooling implications for Sarratt of these two housing applications if approved may mean many Sarratt children will fail to gain places at St Clement Danes School in future.

OTHER MATTERS

- The installation of the new playground at the KGV Playing Fields was completed at the end of March and the playground opened for use over the Easter weekend, with the exception of the roundabout which remained fenced off to allow the surface underneath it to set properly. The supplier has completed an initial Inspection Report and identified a number of 'snagging' items which will be remedied over the next couple of weeks. A number of parishioners have complained about the muddy areas in the playground. These were unavoidable given the extensive rainfall during the installation period but will be seeded and made good. SPC will also be installing additional benches in the playground using funds donated by the Sarratt & Chipperfield Community Foundation. There will be a formal opening arranged in May with representation from TRDC whose grant from their CIL fund made creation of the new playground possible.
- Sarratt has a new Community Support Police Officer Anna Cornish
- Cllr Alder and Mike Edmund are continuing to explore establishing an opt-in mailing list for Parishioners to receive news items from the Parish Council such as upcoming events, road closures etc.

The **next monthly meeting** of Sarratt Parish Council will be held at **7:30pm** on **Tuesday 14th May** in the Rear Room of Sarratt Village Hall. Members of the public and press are welcome to attend.
