FUNERAL OF THE LATE BRIAN WHITEWOOD

Our bible readings this weekend are Isaiah chapter 53 verse 4 to the end

- ⁴ Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
- ⁵ But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities;
- the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.
- ⁶ We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way;
- and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- ⁷ He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;
- he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.
- ⁸ By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested?
- For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished.
- ⁹ He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence,
- nor was any deceit in his mouth.

- 10 Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the Lord makes his life an offering for sin,
- he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in his hand.
- 11 After he has suffered,
 he will see the light of life and be satisfied;
- by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.
- 12 Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong,
- because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors.
- For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

³⁵ Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. 'Teacher,' they said, 'we want you to do for us whatever we ask.'

³⁶ 'What do you want me to do for you?' he asked.

³⁷ They replied, 'Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory.'

³⁸ 'You don't know what you are asking,' Jesus said. 'Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptised with the baptism I am baptised with?'

³⁹ 'We can,' they answered.

Jesus said to them, 'You will drink the cup I drink and be baptised with the baptism I am baptised with, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared.'

⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, 'You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'


