Holy Cross: A Beacon of Remembrance through the Centuries

Holy Cross Church has in its 800 years witnessed profound changes in Sarratt's history. The church has been a constant presence, offering not only spiritual guidance but also acting as a hub for the community. As we gather for Remembrance Sunday, it is appropriate to reflect on the role this historic building has played in times of peace and conflict.

Imagine villagers of the 12th century arriving on foot, many unable to read, yet drawn by the sound of the church bell calling them to prayer. By the 1500s, the village had grown, and the church remained at its heart, offering education, settling disputes, and providing for the poor. In 1850, the Industrial Revolution brought further change, yet the church continued to be a place of support and refuge.

During both World Wars, Holy Cross would have served as a place of solace amidst uncertainty and loss. The community coming together to pray for peace, and many families finding comfort in its walls as they faced the impact of war on loved ones.

Today, Holy Cross continues its tradition of holding a special Church service and a Remembrance Service each November. This latter event, held on the green by the war memorial, is a moment where we pause to honour those who served and sacrificed, and a poignant reminder of the church's enduring role in helping the community remember and heal.

But what does Holy Cross offer now, in a bustling, connected village like Sarratt, filled with clubs and organizations that bring people together? The church remains unique in its ability to provide a space for spiritual reflection and connection that goes beyond social activities. It offers something timeless — a place where people can explore faith, seek solace, and find peace in a busy world. At its core, Holy Cross remains a community hub, welcoming all who enter. It invites us to connect with our past, with each other, and with something greater than ourselves. On Remembrance Sunday, and every day, it continues to be a place of hope, healing, and love.

Holy Cross News

September Meeting of Sarratt Parochial Church Council

At its recent meeting, the PCC reviewed what has been a busy summer. Special services have included the year six leavers service and several Baptisms and Weddings, including that of our own Rector!

September saw changes to the Benefice calendar, with Holy Communion services now being held at 10.45am on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month in Sarratt (1st & 3rd Sunday in Chipperfield). A Book of Common Prayer Service has been introduced on the 5th Sunday of each month and Church Warden Jenny Robert's will be leading Compline on the 3rd Sunday in the month at Holy Cross. A praise and prayer group is planned for the autumn.

The relatively new crafting group has gone from strength to strength, with some members knitting squares to be made into blankets and the growing mother and toddler group has returned after the summer break.

Work has continued to improve the external fabric of the building and to secure the approvals for the new heating system. Assuming planning approval is received from Three Rivers Council by the end of October, it is hoped work will begin in January. This project, which will contribute towards the Church's aim to be net zero carbon by 2030, will be funded by a grant from the St Albans Diocese, donations from the Friends of Holy Cross and several members of the congregation. It was noted that we still need help with several small repairs and other jobs.

Concert Reviews

Martin James Bartlett, Solo piano

With its wide range of music and number of composers, this concert represented making it both an intriguing and exciting prospect. From the opening, it was evident that before us was a world class musician whose skill, caring and passion for the music was beyond any doubt.

The gentle opening, a Bach Prelude in B Minor with the attractive arrangement by Alexander Siloti was beautifully crafted as again the following, Gluck "Orfeo et Euridice" this time an arrangement by the Italian pianist/ composer Giovanni Sgambati. There then followed the Schubert Impromptus Opus 90, at times dazzlingly difficult, a feature which Mr Bartlett clearly relished. The first half of the concert concluded with "Widmung" —Schumann arranged by Liszt; small in size but a real gem and beautifully played.

Following the interval, first Debussy with his Arabesque No 1 with its light and magical harmonies. Next came Ravel with his familiar "Pavane pour une infante defunte" the haunting central tune played simply and therefore with much effect. Then back to Schubert and his song "Standchen", the Liszt transcription for piano, a fine alternative.

The "Liebestod" from Wagner's "Tristan and Isolde" must be one of the most powerful moments in all music and here represented in Liszt's piano transcription demands much to make it work, but in the hands of Mr Bartlett the result produced a magnificent and moving rendition.

Finally, Ravel and "La Valse" - the music really represents the collapse of a way of life following the First World War and the unrelenting and nightmarish atmosphere of that time, here in this performance it more than worked, to perfection.

After much deserved applause a soothing encore moment with the great George Gershwin then away into the warm night with the harvest moon and thinking we the audience were all so lucky to have been there

Anna Tilbrook also delighted us with two solo piano items, Schumann's *Arabesque in C Major* and Debussy's *Ballade*.

The audience's enthusiastic applause was rewarded with an encore of a moving rendition of *Summertime* which perhaps reminded us that summer will come again in its due season!

Jazz in New York

The traffic was horrendous and many punters had to struggle through gridlock to reach Sarratt, but then they were rewarded with an exciting and very special concert.

The Jazz Repertory Company directed by drummer Richard Pite took us for a visit to some of the jazz cafes and clubs of New York in the 1930's just at the time prohibition ended (1933), the difficulties of segregation lessened and the music was changing and developing. We were entertained with old favourites and introduced to new numbers.

The show opened with only 3 musicians on stage and I wondered if the rest of the group were stuck on the M25. But no, they each timed their entrance with memorable solos. First was the captivating piano playing of Nick Dawson, who so cleverly changed his style to suit the different genres of music and finished our evening with the stride piano of Fats Waller and Fats' voice to go with it! Pete Long on clarinet took off at great pace and Richard's drumming added to our excitement. It's great when the leader is obviously so enjoying the fun of the evening.

Had there been a vibraphone in Sarratt before? It was introduced into jazz in New York by Lionel Hampton playing with Louis Armstrong (trumpet and vocals by Enrico Tomasso). We were treated to a stunning vibraphone performance by Professor Anthony Kerr who danced over his instrument wielding two mallets in each hand. The first number was 'Memories of You' but then he showed us how it can be a solo instrument as well as a lovely backing for others – what an experience!

A lasting memory for me will be Vimala Rowe singing 'Strange Fruit'. I felt the presence of Billie Holiday with us and was reminded that in 1939 she felt so keenly about colour prejudice that she changed her record company to sing the number. As well as a great voice, Vimala gives an attractive presentation and movement, a result of her classical training in India. It was lovely to see her communication with each fellow musician.

I went home with relief that the roads were clear, and happily whistling Fats Waller songs. – What fun!

Sarratt Local History Society

History of Holy Cross Church Sarratt

As part of the National Heritage celebrations, we held our September meeting in Holy Cross Church. Greg Edmund opened the evening with a description of the origins of Christian worship in Sarratt and the Chess Valley. While the oldest parts of Holy Cross belong to the last decade of the 12th Century the church was probably built on the site of a wooden Saxon field church or cross which in turn may have been built on an earlier Roman place of worship.

The original church was in the shape of the Cross and John Guy explained how the building was extended over the medieval period as the village population grew with extensions to the Chancel in both the 13th and 14th centuries and the addition of the Bell Tower, with its unusual saddleback roof, in the 15th century. The original bell tower had three bells, with two more added in 1960.

Sue Clark explained that the church would have felt quite opulent in the 1300s, as there would have been hangings of coloured fabric on the walls and the altar, red ochre frescos of pomegranates, pineapples and roses, symbolizing good works in the Chancel and the wall



paintings on the east wall of the South Transept depicting scenes from the life of Christ that we can still see today.

Everything changed with the coming of Henry VIII's reformation in the mid-1500s when the church was stripped of its assets, false ceilings added, and the walls plastered over in plain white to give an image of austerity. Around 1606, a pulpit & tester were installed. Few changes appear to have taken place in the centuries that followed, apart from two galleries being built on either side of the Tower arch and a large vestry being added on the south side of the Chancel for the Sunday school.

By 1859 the Church was in "a dilapidated and deplorable state". Some parishioners thought it should be replaced with a new church on Sarratt Green, closer to the growing village population. However, a gift of £500 was offered by a "noble minded lady" on condition that George Gilbert Scott should be commissioned to restore the church.



Graham Peiser described the extensive restoration works which were carried out by Gilbert Scott including underpinning the walls and pillars, installing new windows, adding two new aisles, a new vestry and porch. Costing in total some £1,400 or £220k in today's money. He also detailed further works that have been carried out in the 20th century to maintain the fabric of the church and mentioned ongoing projects.

Finally, Philip Buller shared with us some of the stories that sit behind the many memorials in the Church and Graham pointed out some of the graffiti on the walls.

Sarratt Wildlife Volunteers

On Sunday October 13th, we had a big task ahead of us. We decided to have another go at some clearance in the Old Chalk Pit at Commonwood. Many of you will not realise there was ever a chalk pit there, but for many years chalk was spread on their fields by the local farmers to add calcium and magnesium, and to reduce acid soil. The weather was reasonable, at least dry, so good for working.

We have worked there in the past and created quite a big open area so that chalk loving plants can thrive, but now it has been taken over by brambles and a small forest of elder trees. These we decided to remove which has created quite a sizable more open glade. Dogs Mercury has also taken over the site, which likes shade, so we hope that with more light this will subside, and Knapweed, Agrimony and even Scabious may return, all loved by bees and butterflies.

A friendly Robin kept us company, attracted by the insects which our work had disturbed. We shall hopefully return there in January to tackle the brambles and make a break –through to another area.

But in November we have another big job to do – we are going to remove a large Laurel bush which has been quietly growing on part of the Village Green almost opposite Morton's Pond. It has become far too big as Laurel is prone to do, so any extra hands to help would be very welcome.

Parish Council Report

Sarah Dobson

The following report covers the key points arising from the SPC Meeting held on Tuesday 8 October.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

David Zerny was co-opted onto the Council. The Councillors welcomed David and thanked him for stepping forward to support the Parish. SPC still has one vacancy for the position of Councillor and is keen to hear from any parishioner willing to join the team, particularly anyone with an interest in supporting Cllr Garvey on the **Environment** agenda.

PLANNING

- **Neighbourhood Plan** The Reg 16 consultation at District level has closed and there were 5 responses, of which:
 - HCC Highways, Natural England and Sports England made some standard comments about factors to be taken into consideration, but no objections
 - A recommendation on the proposed swift and bat boxes, but again no objections
 - One from a developer who commented on the village views and the statement in the plan on no edge of settlement developments, and the fact this is against the NPPF, which SPC believe is incorrect.

Former Cllr Ant Soothill, as part of the NP sub-committee, has responded to TRDC who are supportive of our feedback, and the plan does not need to undergo further amendments. This will now go to the Examiner for her final review and once approved there will be a Parish Referendum to seek approval to the plan.

• Land to the north of Little Green Lane - A developer has opened a public consultation for 600 homes on the Sarratt side of Little Green Lane, alongside Rousebarn Lane, and in Sarratt Parish. The developers are proposing 60% of the site will be green space and there will be a doctor's surgery, one-form entry primary school, shops, community centre etc. The deadline for comments to the developer-led consultation is Sunday 13th

October. SPC will not respond as we don't respond to consultations led by developers and will wait until a formal planning application is put through TRDC for our comments as a statutory consultee. The developers (Richborough) have also approached SPC directly to set up a meeting to discuss their proposed plans. SPC is willing to meet with them for the purpose of receiving information only. A resident on Little Green Lane has emailed SPC stating they had heard there were plans to move the Sarratt / Croxley Parish boundary such that the proposed development falls within Croxley Parish. The Clerk has replied to say we are not aware of any such plans.

• **Green Street, Chorleywood** - The TRDC Planning committee has held a site visit to the 300 / 600 home development on Green Street, Chorleywood. It is understood they will make a decision on whether to approve or refuse the planning application at their meeting at the end of October.

Planning Applications Reviewed:

- 24/1507/FUL: Whiteway Field, Penman's Green <u>Erection of a car port.</u>
 - SPC: No objection.
- 24/1450/FUL: The Orchard, The Green, Sarratt, WD3 6AT Installation of solar panels on existing garage flat roof.

 SPC: No objection. We support the addition of green energy source and the approach to minimise any visual impacts.
- 24/1339/FUL: 15 Church Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6HN Subdivision of site and construction of a detached bungalow with associated access and car parking.

SPC: We do not generally support splitting of existing single plots to provide additional dwellings in the Conservation Area as this can lead to over-development. However, due to the position of this proposal, the fact that this plot is effectively a brownfield site, and the proposal is for a 3-bed bungalow which is an under represented type in the area we are not objecting to this application. If officers are minded to approve, we ask that permitted development rights are removed to restrict this development from being expanded in future.

• 24/1347/PDT: The Laurels, White Shack Lane, Chandlers Cross, WD3 4ND -

Prior approval: Enlargement of the dwelling house by the construction of one additional storey (3.18m in height) and raising of ridge to result in an overall height of 7.95m (Class AA).

SPC: Noted. We assume checks will be made to ensure that neighbouring properties will not be unduly impacted by this application.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

 Cllr Garvey's report thanked the Wildlife Volunteers for raking the hay at the Dellfield Farm triangle and thereby maintaining a small but significant patch of chalk grassland, and thanked Andrew Whitewood for his continued maintenance, particularly of the allotment site.

- Cllr Garvey advised that Emma Dickins will be joining her in implementing the first stage of the 10-year Woodland Management Plan. Quotes are being sought from forestry contractors in order to apply for a £3k grant through the HCC Countryside Management Service. A question was raised about making the woods work commercially. It was noted that so far SPC hasn't planned to fell trees to sell the wood to raise cash to fund the Woodland Plan execution but has said any trees recommended for felling by the Woodland Plan whose wood could be sold, would be.
- Work will be taking place over the October Half Term when Sarratt School is closed to clear the fallen tree from the Cricketers Pond and cut back the reeds.

HIGHWAYS

Cllr Diggins reported on 3 recent conversations with Parishioners on:

- Buck's Hill flooding
- Road safety on the double bend by Holy Cross Church
- The missing 30mph speed limit sign at the bottom of Deadman's Ash Lane.

Cllr Diggins has recommended HCC Highways take a more holistic approach to roads in the Parish with a plan to address flooding, speeding, and potholes. He also reiterated the various links for Parishioners to use to report these issues:

Cllr Diggins has agreed to investigate the possibility of revising the local bus routes e.g. there is no bus service to Chorleywood.

Cllr Diggins also questioned whether work could be done around where in the Parish women and children feel safe to walk, as in Chandlers

Cross there has been some behaviour that has made local people feel uncomfortable. A member of the public advised that in Chipperfield the Parish Council has widened a number of paths over the common to make them feel safer. It was agreed this was a good idea, but

unfortunately many of the Sarratt footpaths are bounded on both sides by fences so making them wider is not going to be possible in a lot of areas. It was agreed Cllr Diggins would raise the issue with the local PSCO at their forthcoming meeting.

POLICY AND RESOURCES

- Payments for the month of September were approved and included the annual insurance premium, and the new bench for Belsize to replace the one that was stolen. The second precept payment of £43,443.74 has been received from TRDC, to take SPC through to the end of the 2024/25 financial year.
- It was agreed that with the exception of the Standing Orders, the Financial Regulations, the Financial Risk Management Policy and Risk Registers, the remainder of SPC's policies did not need reviewing every year and the policy review schedule should be updated such that these other policies would be reviewed on a 2-year cycle going forwards. All of SPC policies can be found on the SPC website.

OTHER MATTERS

- Village Hall Puddingstone Cllr Lowry attended the recent meeting of the Village Hall Committee who will need the puddingstone relocated as part of the Village Hall extension. SPC agreed to relocate it to by the willow on the Green in front of the School.
- KGV Pavilion The application to TRDC for District CIL funds for the pavilion extension and refurbishment is due to go before the TRDC Planning & Resources Committee on 11 November for consideration. £30K has been secured from SPC, the KGV Charity and a local benefactor. The National Lottery has confirmed they will provide £7,700 for the new windows and doors in the main hall. Former Cllr John Rugg is progressing a grant application with the Bernard Sunley Foundation and Tom Shurville is in discussions with the Football Foundation for a contribution from them.
- **KGV Playground** Cllr Alder has prepared a presentation of defective elements in the playground and a short video. This has now been sent to Caloo, the playground installer, with a request

for them to undertake remedial work as soon as possible. Andrew Whitewood confirmed he would get the new benches for the KGV playground installed as soon as possible.
