View from the Pew

Good News comes in many forms: the safe arrival of a long-awaited baby; positive test results providing light at the end of the tunnel after months of treatment; restored relationships following disputes and disagreements. For the people of Syria, the hope of a better life following the downfall of the Assad regime – although only time will tell how that will pan out.

Over recent weeks, we've heard the words of the angel of the Lord to the terrified shepherds: "Don't be afraid. I bring you Good News that will cause great joy for all the people" or as the carol puts it: "Fear not, said he, for mighty dread had seized their troubled minds, glad tidings of great joy I bring to you and all mankind."

So what is this Good News? "Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Messiah, the Lord." The safe arrival of a long-awaited baby – the Messiah had been promised by the prophets more than 400 years earlier.

Light at the end of the tunnel – as John writes: "In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Over 30 years later, Jesus said: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me with never walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

Restored relationships – "to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God."

Regime change – Messiah, the Lord: a new kind of king who came to proclaim good news to the poor, to heal the broken-hearted, to comfort those who mourn. A gracious and compassionate king; a humble and gentle king, full of grace and truth. A king who says, "I am the Living One; I was dead, and now look, I am alive for ever and ever!"

In his letter to Timothy, Paul wrote about God "who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see" – hence the terrified shepherds when the glory of the Lord shone round about them. The Good News is that "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."

The Good News is available to us all but it's our choice whether we believe it or not. Perhaps you'd like to make 2025 the year when you think again about the angel's "glad tidings of great joy".

SPOTLIGHT ON HEATING AT HOLY CROSS

If you've ever attended Holy Cross Church in winter, you'll know all too well the struggle to keep warm! The current heating system, powered by a 40 year old oil boiler, has long been incapable of heating the church comfortably without guzzling an entire tank of costly fuel. Each winter, we've faced the annual question: *Will the boiler survive another season?*

We're delighted to announce that change is coming! Starting in January, a brand-new heating system will be installed to address these issues and provide a long-term solution. The outdated oil boiler will be replaced with state-of-the-art **Air Source Heat Pumps**, which will deliver consistent background heating through the existing radiators and pipework. This system will maintain a year-round minimum temperature of about 12°C, a key step in preserving this historic building. In the past, damp and crumbling walls have caused concern, but the new heating system is designed to prevent further deterioration.

To complement this, we're installing two **HALO overhead heaters** in the main part of the church. These sleek, purpose-built heaters will provide instant warmth, ensuring a cosy atmosphere for services and special events.

Perhaps most excitingly, the new system is a significant step toward



sustainability. Fully electric, it aligns with the Church of England's ambitious **net zero target for 2030**. In recognition of our green efforts, the St Albans Diocese has awarded us a **Net Zero Grant**, covering 20% of the project cost. Additionally, we've secured a **government VAT grant**, further easing the financial burden.

The remaining costs are already covered, thanks to the incredible generosity of church members and a substantial contribution from **Friends of Holy Cross**. We are deeply grateful for their support.

The best news? We're not asking for additional donations for this project! All that's left now is to look forward to a warm and welcoming Holy Cross Church, all year round.

While the installation is taking place Holy Cross will be closed due to safety issues, however during this time there will be a Eucharist service each Sunday at 10.45am at St Paul's Chipperfield. Church will close after the 5th January, 9am, service has finished and we will keep you updated on the re-opening date, schedule for mid-February. Interment of ashes services in the churchyard will still take place, however any other funeral services can happen at St Paul's Chipperfield or wait until the re-opening.

Thank you for your continued support, and we can't wait to share this exciting new chapter with you.

'How to Get Down from a Yak' – tribal textile art. with Chris Aslan

Tuesday 14th January 2025, Sarratt Village Hall

Our New Year presentation is completely different and utterly compelling. Nomadic textiles of the Kyrgyz, Turkaman and Karakalpak are explored, along with the rise and fall of nomadism and where nomadism fits in the modern world. The lecture displays houses made from wool to guarantee warmth in cold winters; carpets which tell stories; embroideries, weavings and kilims with a practical or mythological purpose - all ready to be packed at a moment's notice onto a yak or camel, to move on.

Everyone with an interest in textile art or in Middle Eastern cultures will find this lecture fascinating and rewarding – delivered by a real expert who has lived in these creative communities.

Chris Aslan, born in Turkey, is widely travelled and established a UNESCO workshop in Uzbekistan, reviving 15th century carpet and embroidery design, becoming the largest non-governmental employer. He also lived for several years with nomadic yak herders in the Pamir mountains of Tajikistan. Chris is now a travel guide, writer and lecturer.






The Cubs have had a brilliant time this term. Our first session back after

Parish Council Report

Sarah Dobson

The following report covers the key points arising from the SPC Meeting held on Tuesday 10 December.

PLANNING

SPC Comments on new Planning Applications:

SPC would like to remind parishioners that for certain types of planning applications (typically prior approvals and lawful or permitted development) that these applications are assessed by TRDC from a legal perspective to see if they are lawful, and if they are, approval will be granted by TRDC. As such for these types of applications SPC generally makes a comment of 'noted' unless we have strong reasons to object to the application.

• 24/1918/PDE: The Laurels, White Shack Lane, Chandlers Cross, WD3 4ND - Prior Approval: Single storey rear extension (depth 5.40 metres, maximum height 2.59 metres, maximum eaves height 2.59 metres)

SPC: Noted

- 24/1801/CLPD: Penmans, Penmans Green, WD4 9AZ Certificate of Lawfulness Proposed Development: Stationing of caravan/mobile home for ancillary residential use. SPC: Noted
- 24/1833/OUT: The Royal British Legion site, Church Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6HL Outline Application: Development of up to 18 residential dwellings with access onto Church Lane (Appearance, Layout, Landscaping and Scale reserved) SPC: A comprehensive response will be prepared by SPC before the 3 January submission date. Residents will be made aware of the application using the SPC email distribution list.

To note an application in Chorleywood:

 24/1946/NAC: Chiltern Hills Golf Course, Green Street, Chorleywood - Neighbouring Authority Consultation: Buckinghamshire County Council PL/24/2859/FA: Reconfiguration of existing 9-hole golf course and construction of a golf driving range; construction of green plateau for use as football playing pitches, including a permanent 11v11 football pitch with floodlights; erection of temporary changing facilities; erection of permanent clubhouse; and associated access, landscaping and parking. SPC: There were no comments.

Recent TRDC Planning Decisions:

- 24/0990/FUL: Sarratt Church of England School, WD3 6AS
 Demolition of existing demountable and caretakers block and construction of single storey teaching block with associated landscaping works

 SPC: No objection. We support these improvements within the school site to increase the safety of pupils and staff and improve the learning environment. TRDC: Approved
- 24/1507/FUL: Whiteway Field, Penman's Green, WD4 9AY Erection of a car port. SPC: No Objection. TRDC: Approved
- 24/1450/FUL: The Orchard, The Green, Sarratt, WD3 6AT Installation of solar panels on existing garage flat roof.

 SPC: No objection. We support the addition of green energy source and the approach to minimise any visual impacts. TRDC: Approved
- 24/1391/FUL: Dellfield Farm, Plough Lane, Sarratt, WD3 4NL Erection of agricultural barn SPC: Was not made aware of this application TRDC: Approved
- 24/1339/FUL: 15 Church Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6HN Subdivision of site and construction of detached bungalow with associated access SPC: We do not generally support splitting of and car parking. existing single plots to provide additional dwellings in the Conservation Area as this can lead to overdevelopment. However, due to the position of this proposal, the fact that this plot is effectively a brownfield site and the proposal is for a 3 bed bungalow, which is under-represented in this area, we are not objecting to this application. If officers are minded to approve, we ask that permitted development rights are removed to restrict this development from being expanded in the TRDC: Refused. (The reasons given by TRDC for the refusal were: 1) By virtue of its siting, scale, design and orientation, the proposed development would detract from the neutral contribution the existing

site makes to The Green, Sarratt Conservation Area, resulting in an incongruous addition which would harm the character and appearance of the conservation area. 2) Does not contribute to affordable housing. 3) No evidence for biodiversity net gain.

• 24/1129/FUL: Waterdell House, Little Green Lane, Croxley Green, WD3 3JH – Construction of carport to front of dwelling SPC: No objection. TRDC: Approved

Ref. No: 24/0023/REF. No further updates.</u>

POLICY AND RESOURCES

- 2025/26 Budget The Council reviewed the proposed budget for the next financial year (1 April 2025 31 March 2026) and agreed a 2.5% increase was appropriate to cover the Council's forecast expenditure next year. This will see the budget (Precept) increase from the current year's figure of £108,337 to £111,045 next year. The impact of this for parishioners on their Council Tax is an increase in the cost of the services SPC provides from £97.95 last year to £100.39 next year (or £2.45 for the year) for a Band D Council Tax householder.
- **Policy Review** The following policies were reviewed and agreed for adoption:
 - Co-Option of Councillors
 - Protocol for the Reporting of Meetings
 - Correspondence
 - Press and Media

These will now be made available on the SPC website and reviewed again in December 2026 in accordance with the new 2-year review cycle.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

- Cllr Garvey's reported that the Woodland Management Plan implementation was in progress. She is currently going through the process of selecting a contractor for the tree work and will then apply for a £3K grant to help with this large expense.
- The tree in front of Springfield at the Chipperfield end of Sarratt Green will be cut back by UK Power Networks in the Spring as it's entangled in their power lines. A cordon has been put up around the tree to protect passing walkers from any falling boughs in the meantime.
- Signs stating 'Footpath' or 'Bridleway' have been erected on Dawes Common to request horse riders to refrain from riding their horses on the footpaths as they are getting 'churned up' with the wet weather making it difficult for walkers.
- Quotations are being received to cut back the lilies and reeds in the Cricketers Pond. SPC hopes to appoint a contractor soon, with the work undertaken early in the New Year.
- The Boxing Day Car Festival has been approved and Greg Edmund will be undertaking some metal detecting on the Green the day after. SPC was pleased to learn the Village Hall Committee has approved the installation of a cabinet in the rear hall to display the artifacts Greg has already discovered.
- SPC has delighted to be asked to decorate a tree at Holy Cross Church as part of their Christmas Tree Festival earlier this month. SPC has also received many positive comments about the Christmas Tree it has erected and decorated on the Green in front of the school.

HIGHWAYS

- Storm Damage The recent storms have highlighted the poor state of many of the trees that border our roads, mostly on County Council verges. They shed branches and some fall into the road creating dangerous conditions for all. Cllr Diggins will be writing to the County Council on this.
- Fault Reporting Please continue to report faults using the Herts CC portal: https://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/services/highways-

• Letter on the State of the Parish Roads - A letter has been sent from SPC to the Lead Councillor at Herts County Council, our County Councillor, our District Councillors and our MP, requesting a strategic rethink of how the roads in Sarratt Parish are looked after. A response has been received from our County Councillor, Phil Williams, advising he has passed our letter to the HCC Highways Officers. It is hoped a meeting with them will be arranged in the new year. SPC has also prepared a detailed paper on specific issues to discuss with the Officers, and we hope to engage with HCC Highways officers to agree a maintenance schedule over the next couple of years that prioritises the most urgent problems.

OTHER MATTERS

- KGV Playground Update There was a potential visit from Caloo to the playground last week to level the ground around the roundabout. Cllr Alder had been unable to visit the playground in the last few days to check if they had been, but it's thought a visit would have been unlikely due to the bad weather. Caloo will also come on 13 January (weather permitting) to replace the surface of the basketball court and do remedial work. The Clerk will alert the Village that the playground will be closed at this time. Cllr Alder also advised that following some concerns from members of the public about the other rotating piece of equipment, he had spoken to Caloo who confirmed all the equipment meets the relevant British Standard
- KGV Pavilion Update Cllr Dobson advised the TRDC Policy & Resources Committee had approved £200K of District CIL funding for the extension and refurbishment of the Pavilion. This was followed by a photo-shoot at the pavilion with Cllr Dobson, Tom Shurville of Sarratt Football Club,



Ciaran Reed, our District Councillor and Lead Councillor for TRDC,

Stephen Giles-Medhurst to accompany a press release on the grant that TRDC have now sent out.

When added to the £30K already pledged by SPC, the KGV Charity and a local benefactor, plus £7,700 from the National Lottery, there is still a funding shortfall of ca. £160K. The project team is looking to reduce the total project cost / shortfall with an alternative reducedheight roof structure, which will require a new planning application, although this will not invalidate the £200K grant from TRDC. There will however still be the need to secure additional funds from other sources and the project team will be applying for a grant from the Football Foundation and the Bernard Sunley Trust together with local fundraising activities, which will probably include 'Buy a Brick' for the new pavilion. All of the above has resulted in a decision to push the start date for the construction back to the end of the football season in May 2026, rather than May 2025. The next step is to appoint a professional project management company and run the formal tender process to select a contractor.

- VE Day 2025, 80th Anniversary Croxley Green have succeeded in getting a flypast from the Battle of Britain flight on VE80 Day. Cllr Diggins will pursue this as Sarratt is probably also on the flight path. Chorleywood will share details of their portable beacon as a number of Parish Councils in the district have expressed an interest in this as a potential option for VE Day. Cllr Diggins is also keen to engage with other organisations in the Parish who would be interested in participating in an event to mark this milestone anniversary.
- Joint Parishes Meeting This meeting is held every 6 months and the meeting in November was attended by Cllr Dobson and the Clerk, together with representatives from the other Parish Councils in the Three Rivers District Chorleywood, Watford Rural, Croxley Green, Batchworth and Abbots Langley, together with representatives from TRDC and the Police. The police reported crime figures were down by 16% compared to the previous year, although shop lifting by organised gangs is a growing problem. Using Herts Connect to report crime and provide information can be vital to apprehending offenders. The Police are launching some new initiatives to ensure residents can meet them unofficially like 'Coffee with a Cop' in Rickmansworth at one of the coffee shops.

Chorleywood noted The Bank in Chorleywood, a new restaurant and club, is causing extensive issues with noise and parking. Chorleywood is also planning to become a Market Authority for their Christmas Fair, so eliminating the need for the stall holders to apply for individual licenses. This has the added advantage of enabling Chorleywood to host other fairs. Chorleywood is running a very successful Community Shed for people to come together and is hoping to start up a Repair Café which could rotate from Parish to Parish throughout the year. Details will be shared with the other Parish Councils to forward to their residents.

Shivani Dave, from TRDC came to discuss the Emergency Plan she is developing which sets out how the district will deal with large scale disasters, such as fires and power outages, or flooding. As part of the plan, venues are being identified across the district to be Reception Centres in the event of residents having to be evacuated from their homes. Sarratt Village Hall has volunteered to be one of these. Shivani also reported on the TRDC Local Strategic Partnership, which involves the District Council, the police and fire service and a number of large charities. The objective of the group to make the district a better place to live, and to work jointly to resolve problems, such as belonging, safety, economy, environment and to increase opportunities for job creation.
