# View from the Pew

We are so blessed in our villages to see the seasons change as we move into longer days and hopefully sun. However, things can go unplanned. Floods, rain, snow and fire can cause worry fear and concern to those journeying through.

We can be at a loss why these things occur and its extreme nature - it can challenge our faith and beliefs especially as we see suffering

This month, as we journey into Lent's 40 days to Easter it's a time to pause and reflect – a time to possibly fast - giving up something and using the time or cost for others. Some take courses at local churches, some decide to serve, some decide to just be still and listen. Listen to the pulse of nature, breathe its air as it touches us - it can be different and so special.

Many of us at this stage, will - I am sure, be thinking "chance would be a fine thing!" Then I say, maybe your first prayer would be "Lord, give me some space". For some, it's hard to be still as our mind wanders on who to call, what to tidy, and the general guilt for being still and to switch off can be a challenge.

Our church is open daily. Our beautiful footpaths and woods are there even our showers and bathrooms, on the drive to work and friends, or that plot in the garden we escape to could be the place just to pause, to ask those 'why' questions or just to give thanks.

This year, while on a conference, we looked at different prayers and one was repeating a bible verse, phrase or part of a song. "The Lord is my Shepherd" could be a start. Allowing the words to calm us as we repeat them or consider its meaning with our thoughts.

So however you spend your Lent, why not ask God for a moment to pause and allow it to take us on a journey – a journey that may take us to be thankful for the blessings and the moments we have.

# Sarratt Parish Council Notice VE DAY CELEBRATIONS 8 MAY 2025



This year will be the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day and has been designated a national day of celebration by the Government. It will not be a Bank Holiday but it is hoped that, in common with other organisations and communities across the country, Sarratt will also celebrate this historic event.

In outline only, and broadly following the Government's suggestions, Sarratt Parish Council are proposing the following programme:

- 0900 VE Day Flag Raising and Commemorative Service (Sarratt Green)
- 1730-1830 Family Picnics, stalls, fancy dress and activities (Sarratt Green)
- 1830-1845 Bell-ringing (Holy Cross)
- 1845-2030 Picnics, activities continue
- 2030 Communal Singing
- 2045 Beacon/Bonfire Lit
- 2100 National Anthem

It is hoped that individuals and organisations will want to take stands, organise activities and generally make this a celebratory event to mark the end of the war in Europe.

## Sarratt Village Hall AGM – 8 January 2025

Chairman Roger Dudley reported that the hall has had another successful year, having progressed on building extension plans, with planning permission to build small front and back extensions. These projects will be funded from the existing healthy reserves from several years' fundraising – a big thank you to all who have helped in raising money.

Since the last AGM, Sean Aylett has sadly died – Sean was the architect who designed this wonderful building and was involved when we did extensions and alterations over the years. He did this all for minimal payment – so we would like to acknowledge and record our gratitude to him.

Also thanks to Jenny Roberts for keeping on top of the bookings – not an easy task and to John and Elaine Daly for all their efforts both in setting up the hall, and especially in the cleaning.

Treasurer Colin Plummer gave the financial report for Oct 2024 to Sept 2025. Donations were lower than last year due to fewer fundraising events. However, expenses were down with wage costs a little lower, no large equipment costs, but electricity costs were up as the 5 year contract expired; most other costs were similar to last year. Our aim is that the expenditure plus 10% equals the hire charge income, and any donations and event income are a bonus for improvements, which last year succeeded with a surplus of over £2,200. Future funds will be considerably reduced with our planned extensions and the further 15% VAT on gas and electric supplies. Hire charges have been increased by 3% from 1/1/2025. Colin also thanked Sarah Altman for examining our accounts and preparing her report and hoped she will continue to do so in the future.

The committee currently consisted of 11 members appointed by Sarratt Societies, Clubs, and Organisations, and 5 elected members. Elected members have to be elected every year at the AGM. There are currently no co-opted members. The following five persons offered themselves for election to the management committee: Colin Plummer, Larry Griffiths, Jeff Baker, Anthony Soothill and Tony Bond. Their election was agreed unanimously by the meeting.

pleased to welcome two new members, which took the workers on the day to eleven, plus young Freddie, Janice's grandson, who worked so hard collecting litter around the area.

Many hands make light work, they say – not quite true, as it was hard work removing huge brambles, but we made



great headway and have cleared a large area. The hope is that some of the wild flowers that love chalk and were flourishing there will return. These include beautiful pale mauve Field Scabious,



Knapweed, the yellow Common Agrimony and Wild Marjoram. These are all loved by butterflies, bees and other insects, which in turn provide food for the birds. Hopefully the Dogs Mercury which also grows there will not be too rampant, and Foxgloves will pop up as well.

A very satisfying morning, good fun and good exercise too.

On Sunday March 9<sup>th</sup>, we shall be at Penmans Green, removing yet more scrubby brambles which refuse to give up on areas we have already worked on. Meet at 10am up the stony track from Belsize, with strong gloves and your own refreshments, tools are provided.

# Parish Council Report

Sarah Dobson



The following report covers the key points arising from the SPC Meeting held on Tuesday 11 February.

#### **PLANNING**

Much work has been done over the past six weeks by Cllr Farman and former Cllr Soothill to rework the Sarratt Neighbourhood Plan to comply with the recommendations of the Examiner. Final versions of the plan will be submitted by 21 February for a further six-week District Consultation. It is hoped following this the Examiner's final review will be fairly quick and once she has given her approval, the plan can then be taken to a Parish Referendum. The latest documents are available on the Sarratt Neighbourhood Plan website.

#### Planning Applications Reviewed:

Certain types of planning applications (typically prior approvals and lawful or permitted development) are assessed by TRDC from a legal perspective to see if they are lawful, and if they are, approval will be granted by TRDC. As such, for these types of applications SPC generally makes a comment of 'noted' unless it has strong reasons to object to the application.

- 25/0162/RSP: Coltspring Farmhouse, Coltspring Riding Stables, Sarratt Road, WD3 4LR <u>Retrospective: Change of use of existing</u> <u>ancillary use outbuilding to dog day care; additional hardstanding at</u> <u>frontage.</u> SPC: No Objection
- 25/0111/CLED: Holly Hedges Farm, Olleberrie Lane, Belsize, WD3 4NU - <u>Certificate of Lawfulness Existing Use: Continued use of the land</u> for a single-unit mobile home within the residential curtilage for ancillary use to the main dwellinghouse. SPC: Noted
- 25/0067/CLPD: White Cottage, Sarratt Road, WD3 6AH <u>Certificate</u> of Lawfulness Proposed Development: Erection of a single storey side extension and alterations to fenestration. SPC: Noted
- 25/0068/FUL: 7 Downer Drive, Sarratt, WD3 6BD <u>Alterations to</u> frontage to allow new parking provision including new crossover and alterations to front landscaping to facilitate.

*SPC: No objection. We support this appropriate application that has followed the advice given and has produced a comprehensive application* 

- 25/0079/VAR: Land at the rear of 17 49 & land adjacent to 97 Church Lane, Sarratt - Deed of Variation: Variation of the existing S106 Agreement (relating to planning permission 22/0601/OUT and 22/0602/OUT) to vary the Mortgagee in Possession Clause to reduce the time from five months to three months SPC: This variation is noted. Without any supporting information available for this requested change there is local concern as to the reasons for this change.
- 24/2073/OUT: Land to the north of Little Green Lane, Croxley Green, WD3 3SP - Outline Application: Development of up to 600 residential dwellings (Use Class C3(a)), construction of a 5-bedroom property for childrens social care and supported living (Use Class C3(b)). Two vehicular access points from Little Green Lane and further pedestrian / cycleway accesses. A one form entry primary school (Use Class F1(a)) (plus expansion land for a two form entry primary school). A mixed use local centre including provision for NHS health and social care services (Use Class E(e)), community building (Use Class F2), retail and cafe provision (Use Class E(a-c)), car parking and associated infrastructure. A country park, areas for play and recreation, allotments, community orchard and landscaping with associated infrastructure including sustainable urban drainage systems. (Layout, scale, appearance and landscape as reserved matters).

SPC: Given the substantial scale of the development proposed in this application, immediately adjacent to houses in Croxley Green whilst being part of Sarratt Parish, SPC Planning Councillors have met with the Croxley Green Planning Councillors and will work closely together to construct our respective responses due in on 18 February.

#### **TRDC** Recent Planning Decisions

- 24/1995/PDF: The Mulberry Bush, Moor Lane, Sarratt <u>Prior</u> Notification: Change of use of 3no. agricultural building to flexible commercial use Class C1 (hotels) SPC: Noted. We also note that the Herts Highways response incorrectly includes the Dawes Lane entrance as access. The Dawes Lane entrance by formal agreement is for agricultural use only, so will not apply for the leisure use referenced in this application. TRDC: Approved
- 24/1981/FUL: Dellfield House, Plough Lane, Sarratt, WD3 4NL -Demolition of existing conservatory, erection of a two storey side

extension including accommodation in the roofspace served by rooflights and internal alterations SPC: No objection on the basis this application will result in minimal footprint change, not impact any neighbouring properties and will significantly improve energy efficiency. TRDC: Withdrawn

• 24/1975/FUL: Langdale, Bucks Hill, WD4 9AT - Erection of a single storey side and rear extension; erection of a single storey front extension; internal alterations.

SPC: No objection on the basis that this application appears to be smaller and will have less impact to neighbouring properties than the previously approved application. TRDC: Approved

- 24/1964/CLPD: Sandfield, Dawes Lane, Sarratt, WD3 6BQ -Certificate of Lawfulness Proposed Development: Demolition of existing conservatory and side projection; construction of a single storey side and rear extension; and alterations to fenestration. SPC: No Objection TRDC: Approved
- 24/1730/FUL & 24/1330/LBC: Great Westwood, Bucks Hill - <u>Conversion of garage wing to habitable accommodation to form storage</u> <u>room, staff welfare accommodation and flexible accommodation to</u> <u>provide guest suite or accommodation for live-in carer including</u> <u>alterations to fenestration.</u>

SPC: No objection. If officers are minded to approve, please can they include a restriction that this building must remain ancillary to the main dwelling. TRDC: Approved

 24/2071/PDE, 24/2070/PDE & 24/2069/PDE: Doggetts, Penmans Hill, WD4 9DJ - Prior Approval: Single storey rear extension (depth 8.00 metres, maximum height 3.85 metres, maximum eaves height 3.35 metres)

SPC: Noted. We understand this property is locally listed so we request that checks are made that these proposals do not impact that status TRDC: No objection

• 24/1919/PDT: The Laurels, White Shack Lane, Chandlers Cross, WD3 4ND - Prior approval: Enlargement of the dwellinghouse by the construction of one additional storey (4.77m height) and raising of ridge to result in an overall height of 7.95m (Class AA) SPC: Noted. We assume checks will be made to ensure that neighbouring properties are not unduly impacted by this application. TRDC: Approved

#### ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

The meeting welcomed Jo Deacon, Woodlands Consultant, who is working with Environment Cllr Garvey to deliver implementation of the 10-year Woodland Management Plan to talk about her approach. She will be responsible, with Cllr Garvey, for seeking and analysing quotations obtained for woodland work; applying for grants to help fund the work; and helping SPC ensure the health and safety of the Sarratt woodlands.

Other environment / sustainability matters included:

- SPC's name has been added to a list of councils who support the safe disposal of lithium batteries campaign. This doesn't require any action or funds, just SPC's name as supporters.
- Allotments one plot recently taken, but there are still some vacancies.
- Tree audit Over and above the scheduled work in the 10-year Woodland Management Plan, a regular tree audit needs to be undertaken to identify any new trees in need of attention. The Clerk is coordinating with the Chorleywood Parish Clerk on this, and will learn from their experience.
- Footpaths The gate to the footpath crossing the road over Dawes Lane in front of the metal gate on the other side of the road will be replaced by the Herts RoW team.
- Fly-tipping SPC paid £681.60 for a grab lorry to remove the large fly tips on SPC land in the Dawes Lane car park and Commonwood. There was a total of 2.12 tonnes of rubbish dumped illegally. Thanks go to Andrew Whitewood for arranging its removal.

- Ash tree on the corner of the Cricketers car park adjacent to Sarratt School – TRDC has now given approval for this to be removed (required as it was covered by a Tree Protection Order). The work will be done during the school holidays at Easter.
- Tree at Springfield on the Green BT has now removed this.
- Dawes Wood UK Power contacted to remove the branches close to the power lines.
- Cricketers Pond clearance awaiting final quotations and looking at grants to help fund the work.
- Parking on Sarratt Green the current row of posts will shortly be extended beyond the Village shop to prevent parking on this section of the Green

#### **HIGHWAYS**

- Cllr Diggins noted that many road works are in progress in the area, and that some pothole remediation has taken place. It was also noted that the quality of some of these repairs is of very dubious quality. Cllrs Diggins and Dobson are actively seeking a face-to-face meeting with Herts Highways representatives to agree a plan to address the state of the roads in the Parish.
- Cllr Dobson advised that with effect from 21 February anyone driving along Roughwood Lane between Chorleywood/Little Chalfont and Nightingale Lane will require a permit according to roadside notices although it is not clear how this is going to be enforced or what the penalties might be.
- The Clerk will be following up on a request for the new Shopper Bus to supply a Saturday service

#### POLICIES & RESOURCES

The January bank transactions were approved and the bank statements and reconciliations signed.

The following policies were reviewed as part of the Council's 2-year review cycle - Risk Management, the Financial and Non-Financial Risk Register / Assessments, Asset Management & the Asset Register and Treasury and Investment Management. The policies can be viewed on the SPC website, replacing the previous versions.

#### **OTHER MATTERS**

#### **Great British Spring Clean**

This is scheduled for 21st March to 6th April. The Litter Group are looking at how to make this event special.

#### **VE DAY 80 Celebrations Update**

A first meeting with local village organisations was held on 28 January during which the events proposed for the day were outlined. The day is to be one of celebration to mark the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the end of WW2, rather than one of commemoration. It is planned for Thursday 8 May (actual date of VE Day in line with current government guidance) and will start with a short service at 09:30 at the War Memorial and continue with an evening picnic at 17:30. This will be accompanied by stalls, music, and the lighting of a beacon. The Village Hall has been booked as an alternative venue in the event of bad weather. It was noted Croxley and Chorleywood are planning events on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup>. The final decision on date for Sarratt may be influenced by the availability of some of the activities e.g. Morris Dancers, ice cream van, hog roast etc. The next meeting is on 25 February at 19:30 at the Cricketers Pub for anyone wishing to come along/be involved in the event. A decision on the definitive date for the event is expected to be agreed at this meeting.

#### Sarratt Fair

The Fair organisers joined the SPC meeting and have requested to come to Sarratt on 15-19 July. Council explained there had been concerns from local residents whose homes front onto The Green, about the arrival of the Fair on a Monday for the opening of the Fair on the Friday. There were also concerns the Fair was planning to come when some families would be on holiday. The Fair organisers explained the difficulty of arriving later in the week, as once they had dismantled the Fair at the previous location, they have nowhere to park en-route to Sarratt. In the past they were able to stay at Bovingdon Airfield, but that is now in private use. They also explained SPC's proposal to reinstate the May date for the Fair is not possible this year as they are already booked at another venue. It was agreed the Fair would see whether they could spend extra days at their previous venue, before arriving in Sarratt and would also investigate whether a June or early July date may be possible.

#### Parish Councils Meeting with TRDC

Cllr Dobson attended the quarterly meeting between the District Parish Councils and TRDC, chaired by Lead District Councillor, Stephen Giles-Medhurst. Cllr Dobson summarised the key points arising from the meeting:

• TRDC are installing EV charging points in car parks in the district that they own – there are none in Sarratt. This will include 4 points in the

public car park next to M&S in Rickmansworth (in addition to the 4 points M&S are currently installing in their own car park); Rickmansworth Northway and William Penn car parks; Ferry car park, Lower Road, Chorleywood; and Croxley Green Community Way car park; as well as other sites in South Oxhey and Abbots Langley. These will be available for use by car park users during the day and local residents overnight.

- Climate and sustainability details were provided of the Local Energy Plan and Commercial Food Waste Collection.
- Local Plan The original housing target for TRDC was an advisory 12,500 units over 15 years as set out under the previous National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). TRDC had opted for the lowest impact figure of around 4,500 houses. The new NPPF now requires 13,300 to be built and this figure is mandatory. As the 4,500 house proposal will not now be seriously considered, TRDC are opening a new 'call for sites' with a focus on brownfield locations. TRDC may also include some sites previously discounted in the next iteration. Unless there are some particularly significant / sensitive sites put forward in this next round TRDC are not proposing to run another Reg 18 Consultation and hope to accelerate the process so their new Local Plan can be approved in early 2026.
- Budget a summary of the TRDC budget was provided. Of note was £400K of resources planned to complete the work on their new Local Plan over the next 12 months.
- Local Government reorganisation into Unitary Authorities this will impact the County, District and Town Councils which will merge into potentially 2 separate Unitary Authorities for Hertfordshire (West and East). Parish Councils will remain in place but may have additional responsibilities. This is planned to happen within 3 years, with initial plans to be submitted in March and full proposals in November. SPC agreed it would input its views into the process.

The next monthly meeting of Sarratt Parish Council will be held at 7:30pm on **Tuesday 11 March** in the Rear Room of Sarratt Village Hall. Members of the public and press are welcome to attend.
